The Mayor and City Council of the City of Bayard, County Morrill, State of Nebraska, met in a regular session in the Council Chambers October 10, 2023. City of Bayard, 445 Main Street, Bayard, Nebraska, 69334. Notice of the meeting having been posted in three places: 302 Main Street, 445 Main Street, and 517 Main Street. An agenda for the meeting was made available to the Mayor and each of the Council Members prior to the meeting. There being a quorum of council members present, Council President Marquez called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Council President Marquez presided over the meeting and noted that a copy of the Open Meetings Act is located in City Council Chambers and available to the public. City Clerk/Treasurer Bowlin recorded the minutes.

## **PUBLIC HEARING**

Council President opened the Public Hearing for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program at 7:02 P.M. Bryan Venable with Panhandle Area Development District (PADD) was available to answer any questions.

The project was funded by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The first Public Hearing was held on Thursday, December 22, 2022. The City of Bayard, Morrill County, Nebraska provided a \$340,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) performance-based loan for direct assistance to Al's Market, LLC to assist with direct financial startup costs associated with working capital and equipment for the grocery store business located at 305 Main St, Bayard, Morrill County, Nebraska 69334 (the "Project"). The Project involved a CDBG award of \$350,000 from the Nebraska Department of Economic Development to the City, \$10,000 of which was paid to the city to be used to pay for grant administrative expenses to Panhandle Area Development District (PADD). The Project provided essential goods and services to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic. Initially, the Project was required to meet the National Objective of Low-to-moderate income Jobs (LMJ) and create four (4) new full-time equivalent (FTE) positions. However, due to providing essential goods and services in response to the coronavirus pandemic, the Project was able to transition to meeting the National Objective of Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI). This project benefited 54.73% or 550 LMI persons. Due to the business meeting the National Objective of benefitting LMI persons, they are eligible to have 100% of the \$340,000 performance-based loan forgiven. No residents, farms, or businesses were displaced as a result of these CDBG activities.

After no other public comment, the hearing was closed at 7:05 P.M.
